

Many thanks for all the donations for all our kits, for ladies sewing and tying blankets, especially Julia Pohlmann who binds the edges of all the blankets. Thanks to Glenn and Joan Kirchhoff for the enclosed trailer which transported all of our boxes to Grand Island. Thanks to all who carried the many boxes upstairs and helped load the trailer. We sent 86 Health Kits to Lutheran World Relief, and 25 went to Lutheran Family Services of Nebraska, for a total of 111 Health Kits made. 104 School Kits went to Lutheran World Relief, and 25 went to Royal Family Kids Camp in Nebraska, for a total of 129 School Kits. 48 Layettes went to LWR, and 25 to LFS, for a total of 73 Layettes. 60 blankets went to LWR, 25 to RFKC, and 25 to LFS, for a total of 110 Blankets. Add to that 107 bars of soap and 18 Fabric Kits. Our Thank-offering totaled \$471.85 to help with the shipping of these items.
