Minutes from the Women's Board Meeting-Jan. 21, 2019

The meeting opened with appetizers served by the outgoing board members, after which Jami O'Neal called the meeting to order with 14 members present, 2 absent and 1 outgoing member present. Devotions were given by Louisa on "Belonging".

New members, Linda Fangmeyer, Dawn Buckles, and Judy Kirchhoff were introduced.

Secretary's minutes were read and approved. Treasurer reported a 12/31/18 balance of \$2520.07.

No ballot was necessary as all positions were filled on a volunteer basis. Those were: Coordinator, Jami O'Neal; Vice Coordinator, Connie Meyer; Secretary, Linda Fangmeyer; Treasurer, Mary Jo Hofts; Coordinators of Mission Growth, Mary Jo Hofts-Chairman, Denise Brettmann, Linda Loontjer; Coordinators of Mission Community, Lori Grummert-Chairman, Mary Miller, Dawn Buckles, Judy Kirchhoff; Coordinators of Mission Action, Louisa Fintel-Chairman, Julia Pohlmann, Chandra Hillman, Sandra Spitler. There was discussion on duties of the Committees and making any necessary changes for the yearbook. Pricing of the greeting cards was discussed, noting that this project was done more as a service project for the congregation rather than a money making one.

Louisa reported that the Mission Action projects for 2018 had been sent to the Orphan Grain Train because LWR drop off locations had been changed and were no longer feasible for delivery to those locations. A motion was made, seconded and carried to continue delivering the completed projects to Orphan Grain Train.


Since the Thankoffering offering had previously been used to cover postage to send our projects to LWR, a motion was made, second, and carried to send \$500 to Orphan Grain Train.

Anita Sevensen's position on the board has not been filled and a motion was made, seconded, and carried to not fill it at this time, but to wait until next fall when a member change was made.

New Business – Jami read "Thank You" notes that had been received. A contact sheet of all board members needed to be updated and would be given to everyone. A motion was made, seconded, and carried to stop the monthly donation to Children of the Nations. Soup suppers for the Lenten services would be discussed at the next meeting as no plans for the services were known at this time. It was noted that if anyone knew of kitchen needs, that a listing should be made available for posting so everyone would be aware of such. A motion was made, seconded and carried to again donate \$500 to the Back Pack Program. In theory it would be coming out of the Thrivent balance with the remainder of that money going into the general treasury.

The meeting closed with the Lord's Prayer.
