# Sunday School Offering to Heifer International...

Your donations to Sunday School, December thru February, totaled \$749.20. With that we purchased the following items: 2 Biogas Stoves for \$50 - manure and water produces the gas to run the stove which is used for heat and for cooking and is so beneficial for a family. Mostly they said the stoves are sent to Uganda. One \$300 well, which may be a 20 foot borehole, or a hand pump water well, or some means of getting water for a family or village. One school of fish for \$300 - this is a continual good source of nutrition. And then we finished out the amount with a flock of chicks (\$20) and ducks/geese (\$20). *Thank you all for your generous contributions which will change the lives of someone you've never seen or met, but who will be forever grateful to you and to their Lord and Savior, who answered their prayers.* 

Our Christmas Well Goal Has Been Reached...

The campaign to be able to send enough money to drill one well for a specific village in Uganda has been realized. With your generous extra contributions we've reached an amount of \$10,938.81. It costs \$10,150 to drill a well. *Thank you for seeing this project through to completion!* God is good, all the time ~ And all the time, God is good

Easter Lilies...


We will again be decorating the

# Minutes of Cemetery Board Meeting - March 16, 2017

The Peace Lutheran Church Cemetery Board met on Thursday, March 16, 2017 at 5:00 P.M. Present were board members: Roger Bohling and Dennis Buckles; Cemetery Lot Supervisor, George Kruse, Peace Office Administrator/Cemetery Records Keeper, Marla Maschmann, and Pastor Rich Stevenson. Absent: Board member, Barry Renz

1. <u>A motion</u> was made by Dennis Buckles and seconded by Roger Bohling to approve the cemetery maintenance contracts. Both parties have agreed to continue their contracts for 2017 at the same pay rate of \$30.00 per hour: Earl Hillman mowing the Peace City Cemetery and Betsy Maschmann mowing Zion Lutheran and St. Paul Cemeteries. Motion carried.

- 2. The Board discussed and acted on the following:
- Discussion was held concerning a grave site not yet funded. Letters will be sent again to parties involved.
- The Art Brettmann memorial has been designated for grave stone repair. Marvin Koester had determined 4 stones in the Town Cemetery leaning badly. Spidel Monument of Lincoln, NE, quoted \$679 per stone; Johnson Monument of Belleville, KS, quoted \$300 per stone. <u>A motion</u> was made by Dennis Buckles and seconded by George Kruse to go with Johnson Monument for grave stone repair. Motion carried. Roger will contact them and see when they can work it in.
- Marvin contacted Thayer County Weed Control, but they will not set up automatic fall spraying, so the 3<sup>rd</sup> year Board member needs to contact them every fall about spraying all 3 cemeteries.
- George will let Roger know if he needs assistance setting block markers on reserved sites. The first row in the new part will be kept vacant to allow for more parking.
- Marla, Pastor and George will update the informational guideline flyer presented to area Funeral Homes.
- The Cemetery Board agreed that keeping the weeds sprayed around the outside perimeter of Zion and St. Paul's each summer falls as the responsibility of the 3<sup>rd</sup> year member of the Board, thus Roger Bohling this year.
- George and Marla reported that the maps in the vault were updated in May of 2016 with reservations requested and graves reverted back to Peace Cemetery by those who held reservations they will no longer be using.
- George Kruse had updated the <u>Policy on the Erection of Monuments and Memorials</u> to be given to anyone wishing to reserve their burial plots and those that have reserved plots.

3. Permanent records and certificates are recorded in files and on the church office computer, with back-ups stored in the vault and on dropbox.com.

Meeting adjourned.

## **REMINDER:**

Prior to January 2013, no one was able to reserve their cemetery plot unless they had a spouse or child deceased and burial was granted free to all members of Peace upon their death. With the high cost of keeping our cemeteries maintained and looking nice, the Congregation voted in January of 2013 to set a perpetual fee determined by the Cemetery Board for all members (currently \$350 for members and \$450 for non-members). They also voted to allow members to reserve their plots without a spouse or child deceased. So now, members of Peace are able to make pre-plan arrangements and reserve a plot in any of our three cemeteries, Peace Town Cemetery, Zion Cemetery and St. Paul's Cemetery. Only those who were grand-fathered in with a reserved plot next to a deceased spouse or child have their plot reserved for them without a certificate issued or payment required.

These fees have helped considerably in maintaining a positive balance in the Cemetery Fund. Thank you to George Kruse for volunteering to be the Cemetery Lot Supervisor and to the Cemetery Board for their work in implementing guidelines for reservations and placing temporary block markers in the ground for reserved plots. If you desire to reserve your plot, just inquire in the office and they will be glad to help you.

## **RESURRECTION ROLLS**

(10 ounce) can of refrigerated crescent rolls
 8 large marshmallows
 1/4 cup melted butter
 2 T. ground cinnamon
 2 T. white sugar

This recipe is wonderful to make with kids during the Easter season. The dough represents Jesus' tomb. The white (pure) marshmallow: Jesus. The cinnamon and sugar: burial spices. Kids can place Jesus in the tomb. But when they break open a baked roll, the marshmallow will have disappeared. He is risen!

Preheat oven to 400. Lightly great a baking sheet. Separate rolls into triangles. In a small bowl, mix together cinnamon and sugar. Dip a marshmallow into melted butter, then roll in cinnamon/sugar mixture. Place marshmallow onto the center of a dough triangle and carefully wrap dough around it. Pinch the seams together to seal the marshmallow inside.

Place on baking sheet. Bake approximately 15 minutes until golden brown. Enjoy!
