

Preschool News

March has been a busy month full of learning at Peace Preschool. The children learned about space at the beginning of March. Some of our favorite activities were orbiting the sun as the eight planets (and Pluto, the dwarf planet) while holding different sized sport balls. They also liked creating constellations by using toothpicks to poke holes in black paper at the end of paper towel rolls.

Our next learning theme was for St. Patrick's Day. We learned about shamrocks, four leaf clovers, leprechauns, and rainbows. The children really loved finding the leprechauns that caused all kinds of mischief in our classroom-displacing chairs and furniture and leaving tiny green foot prints around the room, even up to the ceiling! We learned a rainbow song, created a shamrock mosaic with craft foam pieces, and used teamwork to line up different pots of gold in a series of eight sizes. The children really got a kick out of drinking "leprechaun milk" (with green food coloring) at snack time.

We enjoyed learning about different kinds of weather. It was a good opportunity for us to practice our tornado drill as spring storm season approaches. The children sang about the various kinds of weather experienced in spring, used watercolors to paint a weather picture, and practiced following directions and positional words in a game called Puddle Jumping (with blue yarn). The children were fascinated by the "tornado in a bottle," made from connecting two pop bottles together with colored water inside, though it was also overheard that it looked "like a toilet flushing!"

We continue to learn the letters of the alphabet with various experiences. Letter M gave us the chance to experiment with magnets and play a game with marbles. Letter O was all about using opposite words. The very best was making mini pizzas during our study of letter P.

Jesus Time has also been a time of growth this past month. Our discussion of the Prodigal Son and Forgiving Father reminded us that God loves us no matter what. The children learned about Jesus's miraculous calming of the storm. We once again talked about a miracle being something amazing that only God can do. We have also started our discussion of the events leading up to Easter. Pastor Phil has shared the Resurrection eggs, and we have talked about the events of Palm Sunday and the Passover meal. We look forward to hearing of the joy of Jesus' resurrection!
