



Mreschool News...

The preschoolers learned about the tradition of Groundhog's Day as we started February, and



wondered whether he would see his shadow or not. As we learned about the groundhog's burrow and the legend surrounding his forecasting, we also talked about shadows with lots of shadow matching activities. One of the children's favorite Circle Time activities was creating shadows on an overhead projector as their classmates tried to guess what was casting the shadow. The children also enjoyed reading Frank Asch's Bear Shadow, as we have read several of Bear's adventures throughout the year so far.

Our next February theme was post office and hearts. The children had a great time with our discovery center, which was transformed into a post office set up. The children used envelopes, sticker stamps, rubber stamps, and mailboxes to create and send mail to one another. In Circle Time we learned that all letters must have an address for the person who is to receive the mail, and we also learned that stamps show that a letter has been paid for to send. The children got to try their hand at delivering mail in several different ways-matching stamps, looking at shapes, and even the challenge of trying to match street address numbers.

We have continued our study of the alphabet with the letter people. The children met Ms. F with funny feet, Mr. G with his gooey gum, Mr. H with happy hair, Mr. I's impossible inches, and Ms. J with her jingle jacket. Each letter person has a catchy song emphasizing the sound the letter makes. We try to do a project relating to each letter as well. For F we painted fish, and for G we covered a G with green glitter. As H happened at Valentine's Day, we were able to practice cutting out a heart, and we used rulers to measure how many inches our feet were for letter I. We continue to review the previous letters as we continue through the alphabet.

Jesus Time lessons have been focused on God's love for us, His Children. We learned the story of Jesus blessing the little children and how Jesus shared His time and attention with His smallest followers. He even told His disciples to be like small children in their faith! We have also been learning about the parable of The Lost Sheep, and how Jesus is our Shepherd, who knows and loves every one of His sheep.
