

\$661.45 is the amount received through Feb. 19 for our offering to Heifer International. Some new choices on their order form are a Biogas Stove for \$50 - manure and water produces the gas to run the stove which is used for heat and for cooking and is so beneficial for a family. Imagine how your life would change if you suddenly had a stove for those things where you didn't before. Mostly they said the stoves are sent to Uganda. And a \$300 well could be a 20 foot borehole, or a hand pump water well, or some means of getting water for a family or village. Both useful gifts that are so critical to everyday life. A school of fish is \$300 and is a continual good source of nutrition. And then there are also animals, big and small, which help the families become more efficient and productive on their own. Your input is always welcome as we consider what gifts to purchase.
