Are You in Strict Training?

Are you in strict training or are you getting pudgy and vulnerable to serious injury?

You probably think that I have asked kind of a personal question. But you must understand the question I am asking has nothing to do with physical fitness or physical training. I am inquiring of your spiritual training!

The apostle Paul referred to this very matter in his first letter to the Corinthians, chapter 9 beginning at verse 25, "Everyone who competes in the games goes into strict training. They do it to get a crown that will not last; but we do it to get a crown that will last forever. Therefore I do not run like a man running aimlessly; I do not fight like a man beating the air. No, I beat my body and make it my slave so that after I have preached to others, I myself will not be disqualified for the prize."

Paul is telling us that athletes that compete to win, work hard and are involved in a strict training regimen. The season of Lent is a good time to remind and commit ourselves to such a "spiritual training regimen."

Jesus our precious Lord and Savior took upon himself all the punishment that was intended for us and by his innocent death and resurrection won for us the crown of life.

By faith, that crown of life is ours. But it is the mission of Satan to inflict injury upon us that is eternal in nature. He would hope that we are not spiritually "in shape" so that he can cause us to fall from faith and in turn lose that crown of life.

How do we keep from "running aimlessly" as Paul put it in his letter? How do we keep from "beating the air"? Well our Lord has given us exercise equipment!! That's right we don't have to go out and buy it. The equipment he has given us is His Word, The Bible, and Prayer. Through prayer and God's Word we are built up so that Satan cannot cause us spiritual injury. Satan would have us leave our prayer life and Bible study time in the corner somewhere like a little used "exercise bike" or "stair climber"!

I pray that you daily come to the Lord in prayer. Jesus said, "Come unto me all ye that labor and are heavy laden and I will give you rest." Daily open God's Word and regularly come to a Bible study here at Peace lest you become spiritually pudgy and susceptible to injury by Satan.

2021 is the year for us all to be in strict spiritual training. I pray it will be a year we can expand bible study opportunities among us. Come to the Lord's house not only for worship, but also for Sunday school and Bible study.

Hygiene Kits from Becky Mize, Mission Action

Team Coordinator

During the weeks of Lent, we are collecting items for hygiene kits. Hygiene kits distributed through Orphan Grain Train provide dignity and self-worth to those who don't have access to these basic items. A hygiene kit can be such a blessing to someone who has been displaced from their home by a natural disaster, fire, or other circumstance beyond their control. Another group of people we at Peace Lutheran help are the kids who attend a local Royal Family Kids Camp. Some of these children lack the skills and items needed to care for themselves on a daily basis. At camp they are taught basic hygiene habits and a hygiene kit is sent home with them. This small act can help restore self-worth to a child who may think no one cares about them. Hygiene kits include the following items:

- 1 bath towel dark colors
- 1 wash cloth dark colors
- 1 adult size toothbrush in original package-soft bristle preferred
- 1 bar of soap in original wrapper
- 1 sturdy comb large tooth
- 6 band aids ½" or ¾"

RFKC has requested we also include elastic hair ties, elastic headbands, and barrettes for the girls. Any donation of these items will be appreciated. You may bring your items any time and place them in the plastic tote in the overflow. The kits will be assembled soon after Easter.

BLANKETS:

We are again tying blankets. Dates scheduled are Friday March 5 from 1 to 5, Friday March 12 from 1 to 5, and Monday March 22 from 1 to 4 and 6:30-8:30. Please watch the bulletin for any changes in dates and times. If you wish to sew blanket tops at home, there are kits on the table in the overflow. Blankets are distributed through Royal Family Kids Camp and Orphan Grain Train.

New Playground Equipment for the Peace Lutheran Preschool



We are excited to announce that we have chosen to work with and eventually purchase equipment from Crouch Recreation in Blair, NE. Crouch Recreation can provide us with a line of playground equipment that is known to be safe and stand up to years of use. They have provided equipment in surrounding communities that have been reliable for many years. This playground equipment will focus around a large play set that is designed for the preschool to 12-year-old category. There will also be a Crawl Tube and Playhouse, these additional items will round out the playground north of the church. The equipment was decided on with safety, durability, longevity and play value in mind.

This project has a cost breakdown of, a main playground set for \$12,900, a crawling tube for \$2500, a playhouse for \$425 and recommended rubber mulch for up to\$3000. There will be some other costs associated with construction and we will need to provide volunteer labor. The total cost of the project is estimated at just under \$20,000. During the research and decision-making time for the project almost \$9000 has been

given from various sources. These monies include foundation gifts, memorial gifts, an endowment fund contribution, group donations and individuals donating to the project fund. Additionally, we are currently applying for grants from area utilities to help supplement funding this project. This playground equipment will serve the church, preschool and community for years to come and we hope that you can help us attain our fund-raising goals so that it can be a reality for the near future.

We will soon have a display in the overflow of the projected playground to help visualize the items we want to purchase. Thank you to our preschool teacher/director Kim Roth for her time in guiding the Council on this project. Thank you for considering this as we look forward to using this equipment in our ministry at Peace!
