Vance Blackfox (Cherokee) is the new Executive Director of the Oaks Indian Mission, which is located in his hometown in the heart of the Cherokee Nation: Oaks, Oklahoma. Over the years, Vance's journey has led him across the country to serve professionally for the Women of the ELCA, Augsburg Fortress Publishers, California Lutheran University, ELCA Youth Ministry, the Metropolitan Chicago Synod and the Lutheran School of Theology at Chicago. He has also worked in leadership development for the Cherokee Nation and USAA.

His current position at the Oaks Indian Mission has brought his journey full-circle – leading him back home to the community that raised him and to the calling his family has followed for generations. Vance's ancestors were among the first to be baptized by the Moravians in Springplace (in what is now known as Georgia), when missionaries were invited into the Cherokee Nation in 1801. They worked faithfully alongside the Moravians to build both a school and a church in service to their community. Today, over 200 years later, they carry on this legacy, caring for Native American children at Oaks Indian Mission in cooperation with Eben Ezer Lutheran Church and the Oaks Mission Public Schools.

"It is an honor and a privilege to be called home to serve our children and our community. I look forward to journeying more closely alongside all those who support this historic and important ministry of caring for Indian children here at the Oaks Indian Mission. It is certainly a very special and rare gift that countless Cherokee, Moravian and Lutheran saints have left in our hands."

Vance holds a bachelor's degree in communication and ethnic/cultural studies from Texas Lutheran University. He studied leadership and ethics at John Brown University's graduate school, and completed a master of arts in theological studies with a concentration in American Indian ministries at LSTC. He looks forward to continuing his studies in LSTC's ThM/PhD program.

Financial News from Becky Mize, Peace Treasurer

In August, Stacey Duensing began her first year at Western Theological Seminary in Holland, Michigan. To date, members of Peace Lutheran have contributed \$5,752 to assist her with tuition and other expenses while attending seminary. To help us meet our goal of \$10,000, you may place your contribution marked "Seminary Support" in the Sunday offering plate or drop it off during office hours.

During 2014 Peace Lutheran had \$5,500 of matching funds for the ministry of Lindsey Mueller in Uganda. To date we have sent a total of \$7,732.12 to help provide much needed equipment and supplies for her school. There is still \$1,633.94 matching funds available. Please mark contributions "Uganda school" and help us send another \$3,267.88 to support Lindsey in her ministry to these children who otherwise would not have the opportunity to go to school.

For the past several years, during the Advent and Christmas Seasons, Peace Lutheran has raised money to drill wells in Africa where there is dire need of good, clean drinking water. Many of us struggle with gift giving this time of year; why not consider a donation to this worthy cause and give a community the gift of water that will improve their lives year round. Cards are available in the office if you wish to make a donation in honor of someone. The cost to drill a well is about \$10,000 and we already have \$1,721 towards this goal. Please mark your gifts "African well".

Peace Lutheran continues to help combat hunger in the world with our monthly auto giving program. We currently have 27 participants and send \$345 per month through Lutheran World Relief. If you wish to participate in this program, please stop in the office for forms and instructions.

<u>Thank you</u> for your support of these missions where the love of Christ is shared around the world!

One last reminder, Peace Lutheran Church accepts gifts of grain of any kind and in any amount. Please notify the office when you have delivered grain for the church so that it can be taken care of in a timely manner. If you wish to remain anonymous, we ask that you have the elevator personnel call the church office. Funds Needed for Parsonage Updates...

It has been over 16 years since many items in the parsonage have been renovated. The Church Council would like to get started on updates to the parsonage as soon as possible to prepare it for the next pastor that we call. All windows are very old and are not energy efficient. The Council has voted to replace windows for a cost of \$8700. The kitchen is in need of new cupboards and countertops. The Council has voted to replace the cupboards and countertops for a cost of \$7925. Other updates that are needed include carpeting, paint, window treatments, kitchen flooring, and basement renovation. All of these updates will bring our total needs to at least \$25,000. There is currently \$8200 in the Building Fund, leaving us with a need of approximately \$17,000. These projected expenses are currently within our budget because at the present time we are well under our budget for the year. However, our current account balance is quite low. Please consider the parsonage updates in your offering these next couple months so that we can prepare a good home for our next pastor. Designate any offerings for the parsonage to the "Building Fund". ~ The Church Council

Call Committee Update by Bill Mize, Call Committee Chair

The Call Committee continues to meet often. We continue to ask for your prayers and ask you to pray for our next pastor. At each step we learn more about the discernment process. We ask for continued patience knowing that God is leading us.

I left off in last month's newsletter at the gathering of candidates' applications or resumes. This is where we are in real time as a Call Committee. There are different avenues of gathering names of possible candidates and we are looking at these different ways as we move forward. As I mentioned last month, the LCMC website is a place that is widely used for congregations and pastors that are involved with, or available for, a call. The committee is always open to names or networking to lead us to candidates. The LCMC is an affiliation that is all about networking with one another, person to person and congregation to congregation. It's about helping one another in Christ, with an open and honest relationship, loving one another.

As a committee, it is part of our job to find the best possible candidates for our call process. And from there we go to the next step, one of much discernment. In the next step of the call process timeline we will review candidate resumes and select those that will move to the next phase. To those that are selected for this phase we will send out theological questionnaires to be written and returned. This step also includes an initial interview using a conference call or more probably the use of Skype (video conference) to interview the individuals. With much prayer and discernment we would narrow down the group and select one or more candidates to have face to face interviews before the Call Committee makes a final choice. Once this is done, that person is recommended to the Church Council for approval. The Church Council will more than likely visit with the final candidate before voting on this recommendation. Once the Council approves a candidate the congregation will vote to extend a call to this individual to be our new pastor at Peace. Of course there are many little details through these last steps, with your prayerful support we will work through them all.
