THANK YOU FROM OUR MISSIONARY, LINDSEY MUELLER...

Peace Lutheran Church,

I am finishing my three months back in the US. It didn't go exactly as I had thought it would go, but as I reflect, I know that it went exactly as it was supposed to go. And I thank God for that. I have had the opportunity to step back from my work in Uganda and re-center and re-focus myself. I love working in Uganda, but it turns out there is such a thing as second hand trauma and I had some healing to do myself. Seven years of abuse, death, injustice, and corruption took its toll on me and even though those things did not happen to me, they happened to the ones I love. Thankfully a wonderful counselor walked me through some healing and has given me new tools to help me in the future. I tell you this not to make you feel sorry for me or to make myself out to be a martyr. I tell you this because I ask that you continue to stand with me in prayer. This is the best work I have ever done in my life. And it's also the hardest I've ever done.

I cannot finish these months here without reminding you how thankful I am. I have told you in the past that you are not a normal church. And I stand by that statement. In the last few months (on top of the monthly support you provide) you have now provided money to take our 7^{th} graders on their annual field trip and enough money to provide reader books for our 1^{st} , 2^{nd} , and 3^{rd} graders. And what blows my mind is you are always asking, what's next? Like I said, ya'll aren't normal. And I praise God for that.

Paul knows best how to express thanksgiving in the Bible. He does it multiple times because it's important. And if Paul thinks it's important to thank the people supporting him, then who am I to disagree! As I think of you Peace Lutheran Church, the following verses stand out to me:

I thank my God every time I remember you. In all my prayers for all of you, I always pray with joy because of your partnership in the gospel from the first day until now, being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus. It is right for me to feel this way about all of you, since I have you in my heart; for whether I am in chains or defending and confirming the gospel, all of you share in God's grace with me. God can testify how I long for all of you with the affection of Christ Jesus. And this is my prayer: that your love may abound more and more in knowledge and depth of insight, so that you may be able to discern what is best and may be pure and blameless until the day of Christ, filled with the fruit of righteousness that comes through Jesus Christ-to the glory and praise of God." Philippians 1:3-11

You bring me joy. In a world where joy is sometimes hard to find, you are a light. And your light shines not only in Deshler Nebraska, but around the world to people you have never even met. That is the true Gospel at work. That is the God I serve with you. He's that big. He's that good. And He's not done working with us yet.

Hello,

Dear Rev, Rodney and Mama Malinda in Christ Jesus, Rev, Timothy and Mama Beveley in Christ Jesus.

Greetings to you from Paul and Comfort in our Lord, Master and Savior Jesus Name.

He the living God of Israel will not forget you forver and your generation in Jesus name, all the supports that are supporting you for the kingdom of God sake their names shall writing in the book of life and they shall enter in to the glorious city in Jesus name.

THE EASTER CONVENTION REPORT.

God has made another successful convention for us since he Son has resin from the dead to Glorify he God's name, the empty tomb make us proud his name be glorify.

We started our Easter convention at Berinyasi on the 29th March, 2018 and end the convention 1st April 2018 Sunday 3.00pm. Though many members went to down south Kumasi and Accra and other Villages in down south looking for jobs but our membership at convention graund we are 1250. Adults the children camp they are 300. And the new people that came to accept Christ in our last Christmas convention, it was 28 of them come to Easter convention 10 men but all the 18 women come even with their children thank God for that. And Sunday 1st April in the church service one woman brought her son about 30 years he sick to the church that the child father having cocoa farm at Kumasi ant the father died so the take over the cocoa farm (2) two years now and the child fell sick and they brought the child back from Kumasi, and people talk about me that if she bring her child to me in the church the child will heal so when they were coming to the church they carried the child with motorbike because he cannot walk, so I call the disciples and the church elders we all pray, then I pray and call for water and pray over the water and made a sign of cross and gave the water to him to drink after drank the water and pray for him and I asked her child to wake up and the child got up and walk with his mother and they both went home, the whole church claps their hand even wondering, God had done wonderful miracles in the Jesus resurrection day in our church, praise God for that.

And when we finished the convention 3:00pm we still went and baptized 13 people, 5 woman, 8 men because it rain about three (3) times so there is water in their river there.

The living God of Israel is doing wonderful things in our church praises him and give him the Glory in Jesus name. And 4th April 2018 when I am in the house one (1) our church woman died at Mwinkpa church so the disciple call me and told me, and their even told me to rest because they said I tire and they will bury the woman and they buried her Thursday morning on the 6th April,2018, pray for their commitment. Rev, Sampson came to Wa and we had successful meeting with him so when we left I fell sick. I delay to sent my reports from April 2018 because when we finished our Ester convention I was not feeling well enough to go to café to type them. So before I became well my wife Comfort father died on the 27th of May 2018, so we both have to go and also went with our daughter Ruth, so when we came to Wa again I had infect in my stomach, which is typhoid, so am on drugs now and yesterday 22nd June 2018, my wife Comfort mother died so because I am not well I couldn't go with her, even they will not perform the funeral yet they will Waite for after charismas before they perform the funeral, she alone went to the mother's funeral. I still am pleading you to support me with my electricity money (\$700) Seven hundred dollars.

So now I need more prayers from you. I will always say may Israel God richly bless you all and add longer life for his kingdom sake.
