Blessings to everyone at Peace Lutheran Church! I am posting the following from my daughter Nikki Holling-Felmlee with Cornerstone for Orphans as she and her husband are in China adopting Blakely, their 2nd little girl from China.

Hi everyone! I am so grateful for your amazing love and support! There are no words to describe the joy I get when others reach out to the ophans!!!!! Thank you to each and everyone of you for the hard work and time you put into raising the funds to help in such an amazing way!!!

There are 17 kids and 19 people total! A husband and wife are taking care over all the children!

It's an amazing thing what you have done!!! We can now get the \$600 worth of wiring, outlets, and light sockets to hook up to the generator we just purchased them! Also a tv (\$100) for the kids to use when it gets dark, so they have something to do at night (it gets dark early there and it's not very safe outside after dark)! The last \$424 will go towards the next month of food to feed them all 3 meals a day including milk, water and juice! That's about 1800 meals possible?

The glory in this is all God's as He uses us as His hands and feet to further the kingdom of Heaven!

To be an advocate and to help the less fortunate, to be their voice and to feed and clothe those who have no food or clothes is to feed & clothe Jesus? it makes my heart happy! We are living proof of his promises!!!
